

## Service Animal Etiquette

		Service animal etiquette: What you need to know.
Luna	Hi, I'm Luna and this is Bruce, my service animal. Service animals have different specialties. For example, I have epilepsy and Bruce is trained to alert me when I am about to experience a seizure.	
Luna	Bruce wears a vest that lets people know that he is working, however, not everyone knows how to appropriately interact with him.	
Luna	We are going to talk about the golden rule for service animal etiquette – always approach the owner, not the service animal!	Approach the owner Not the animal




## Luna When approaching a service animal, you Camera zooms in to Luna and pans up slightly never know if that animal is actively helping their owner. Trying to get the animal's attention like calling to them, or petting them can distract the animal and potentially prevent the animal from assisting their owner. Camera zooms and pans to left to prep for signaling text: □₄ Luna You should always approach the owner and ask permission before trying to interact with a service animal. When you see a service animal, Remember the golden rule! (Luna stops talking and allows Ask the owner first viewer to read screen): Let's try this scene again, using the golden rule! **Greeting** a **Service Animal Asking permission**

		(Camera Zooms in to Man and Luna)
Man with Glasses	Aw what a cute dog! Excuse me, what's your dog's name?	
Luna	This is Bruce, he's my service dog.	
Man with Glasses	Nice to meet you Bruce! Do you mind if I pet him?	
Luna	Thank you so much for asking, but Bruce is working right now and can't be distracted, sorry about that!	
Man with Glasses	No problem, have a nice day.	
Luna	You too!	
Luna	The other common situation I experience is when Bruce approaches other people.  When a service animal approaches you, this could mean anything from curiosity to something more serious like their owner needing help!	(Camera will zoom in on Luna)

Even when a service animal approaches you, this does not mean it is okay to pet or talk to the animal. Make sure to alert the owner and then follow the golden rule and ask permission if you still want to interact with the animal.

Let's take a look at our next example, this person will show us a great way to get my attention when Bruce approaches her without interacting with him.








(Bruce walks over to another person in the store)



Woman	Excuse me! I think your puppy wants something – how can I help?	
Luna	Thank you so much for letting me know!	
Luna	Bruce just got distracted, I'm fine. Sorry about that. Come here Bruce.	
Luna	In this video we learned two things, to ask owners before interacting with their service animals and to alert the owner if a service animal approaches you.  While some owners are open to having their service animals get pet, you should always follow the golden rule and ask before approaching a service animal. Finally, when a service animal approaches you, make sure to check in with the owner and continue following that golden rule.	Ask
